Checklist for Financial Aid Towards Flight Training



Enroll in Aviation Management and Career Pilot Technology degree program¹

□ Apply for financial aid yearly by completing the FAFSA application (<u>www.fafsa.gov</u>). The FAFSA will determine if you are eligible for any federal, state, or institutional aid. The federal school code for A-B Tech is 004033. You will then receive either a letter via USPS or an email referring to your Student Aid Report (SAR) which is used by the A-B Tech financial aid department in determining your eligibility for aid.

□ Schedule an appointment with financial aid office and find/fill out important A-B Tech forms at <u>https://www.abtech.edu/financial-aid-home/applying-aid</u> (<u>Note, even at</u> <u>the maximum allowance for federal or state financial aid, this amount will only cover up</u> <u>to 47% of the cost of flight training, thus additional aid/funding will be required for flight</u> <u>lessons</u>).

□ Apply for scholarships <u>https://www.abtech.edu/content/scholarships/scholarships</u> Note that A-B Tech does have competitive aviation scholarships for both academics and for flight training.

□ Contact your local bank/credit union for an application for a private student/personal loan. Not all banks and/or credit unions have this option so please inquire first before attempting to apply.

□ Apply for private student loans by contacting WNC Aviation and speaking with the owner of the flight school 828-687-7540. (Note that if you cannot pay out-of-pocket for flight training you will need to apply for a private student loan. This private student loan in conjunction with the A-B Tech financial aid should cover the cost of flight training.)

¹ Note that you must be in the degree program, not a certificate program to obtain Federal Financial Aid through A-B Tech.
