Motorcycle Safety Education Program



This Basic Rider Course is certified by the NC Motorcycle Safety Education Program and conducted at a pace that results in successful completion for most novice riders. No experience is necessary; a good sense of balance is required (you must be able to ride a bicycle). If you experience significant difficulty or become a safety risk to yourself or others, you will not be permitted to continue to ride. To receive the NC Motorcycle Safety Education Program endorsement card you must attend one hundred percent of all scheduled course hours.

Friends Build Better Future for Themselves and Their Families Through A-B Tech



Camron Davis and DeAngelo Wright are both working at a great career with a bright future at GE Aviation, after taking aerospace composites training classes at A-B Tech. However, these friends didn't always have the best opportunities.

"What put me over the edge was when on my twelfth work anniversary, I got a ten-cent raise," Davis said. "I promised myself I wouldn't be there the next year." It's more than throwing boxes and sinks on shelves all night long. I learn something new every day. I can go almost any place on the entire line to work. I can train someone who doesn't have any experience."

"And there's still room to advance—we're growing hand over fist daily with the demand, the parts that we need, the people coming into the shop. It looks to me like that will continue for the next two to three years because the demand is so high."

Prepare to Earn a Real Estate License at A-B Tech through Affordable Classes



A-B Tech Community College is offering a broker prelicensing course at A-B Tech Madison this summer to prepare students to pass the real estate license exam at much lower cost than private schools. Real Estate Educator Anne Rasheed, who has nearly 30 years of experience, will teach the 75-hour Real Estate Broker Prelicensing Course.

"My class is for people who want to get a real estate license," Anne said. "You can take and pass the class, pass a state exam, and begin a new career with no student debt." The course curriculum and exam are provided and regulated by the NC Real Estate Commission.

Because A-B Tech is part of the statewide community college system, tuition prices are regulated to keep training affordable for the community the college serves. The class will cover topics including basic real estate principles and practices, law and contracts, financing, closing valuation, fair housing and real estate laws.

"I enjoyed teaching at the private school, but the class sizes were so big that it was hard to connect with the students," Anne said. "I had 15 students in my first real estate pre-licensing class at A-B Tech. All 15 students passed the class. Anyone in real estate will tell you that's extraordinary. With the smaller class size, I can offer students more one-on-one time. The schedule is also appealing to people who have fulltime jobs."

Anne, a native of Pawleys Island, SC, took a real estate class at night at a community college while she was a senior in high school. "I passed the real estate class and exam and the day after I turned 18, they sent me my license. My first sale was the house I had grown up in."

After graduation, Anne left to attend Appalachian State University and majored in real estate. She stayed in Boone to pursue her real estate career and bought her first company within a year. She has won The North Carolina Real Estate Educator's Instructor of the year award and was the first ever recipient of The North Carolina Real Estate Commission's Billie J Mercer Excellence in Education award.

"My students have begun baking and bringing food for the entire class," Anne said. "You have to smile, that's what puts the 'community' in community college. I also watched the students help each other."

In 2017 our region was awarded \$250,000 for a competitive innovation grant from the NC Department of Commerce to expand NC Works services to underrepresented populations and communities. The goal was to upskill at least 100 individuals to equip them with a postsecondary credential so they will be on a career pathway to earn \$15 per hour or more.

Up Skill WNC—Buncombe was expanded in October 2017, when A-B Tech Community College hired it's first Certified Peer Support Specialist. In January 2018, the focus shifted, now honing in on justice involved citizens who are reentering society within the past two years, the assessing and meeting of the criminogenic needs, and by doing so decreasing the chances of reoffending.

Up Skill WNC 2.0 is a community based peer support program for justice involved citizens who are reentering society and the workforce. Those who have been released from prison within the past year will receive priority for community based peer support services. Up Skill WNC adopted the comprehensive case management style of care coordination from the Care Coordinators of management care organization, VAYA Health. Community based peer support services include: navigating the NC Works system, transportation to appointments and interviews during initial stages of reentry, training on how to talk about "the tough stuff," enrollments while in custody whenever possible, home visits, coordination of reentry services with community partners, assistance with applications for entitlement benefits, assistance with A-B Tech enrollment steps, judicial advocacy, progress reports to probation and parole, and more. The comprehensive, care coordination ensures that justice involved citizens do not become victims of the opportunity gap and "slip through the cracks." Navigators provide the additional motivation and peer support while connecting each participant to the community resources that are available to them. We also have wonderful partners, like the Walnut Cove Community, who contribute to our supportive services funds that help with emergencies, bills, trainings, etc. As peer support specialist who have successfully reentered society, we understand the unforeseen needs of our clients.

Up Skill WNC 2.0 is a pipeline development tool for companies whose hiring policies permit them to hire justice involved citizens. The goal of Up Skill WNC is to secure living wage jobs for justice involved citizens with hopes of solidifying career paths while doing so. By collaborating with companies in various industries, Up Skill WNC 2.0 strives to establish apprenticeships (preferably registered with the US Department of Labor) and write On-the-Job Training (OJT) Contracts, so that the needs of the employer and employee are met: skilled laborers for the employer & real income for the employee. Many have said that work based learning is the solution.

Twenty new students joined Lead Instructor and Coordinator Jay Kaufmann in the classroom of the Barber Academy on January 21 for its first class.



The new program is one of few barber training programs in the state offered by community colleges and the only one offered west of Shelby. Local barber shops and cosmetology salons that want to provide professional barbering services have expressed great interest in the new program. The Academy will prepare students to apply for and pass the licensing examination offered by the North Carolina State Board of Barber Examiners (NCBBE).

"As we are approaching the second session of the program, I am honored to say that all of the students are doing great," Kaufmann said. "They have come to understand being a professional Barber is so much more than learning how to cut hair (which isn't as easy as you may think). They have grown professionally and personally as they have formed a spirit of community with their classmates."

The Barber Academy is located in the Birch Building on A-B Tech's Asheville campus. It is adjacent to the cosmetology program's Cosmetology salon and classrooms, but the programs are not affiliated. 

From Beginning to End A-B Tech is There

A-B Tech is widely known for its various locations: <u>Asheville Campus</u>, <u>Enka Site</u>, <u>Madison Site</u>, <u>A-B Tech South</u> and <u>A-B Tech Woodfin</u>. But that is only the beginning...

The **Emergency Services Department** program takes in-service training to many fire stations in Buncombe and Madison counties, which allows those departments to avoid taking on-duty firefighters and equipment out of service or out of their district for training. This also gives off-duty EMS and fire personnel a convenient location for catching up on their mandatory training.

Transitional Studies has High School Equivalency partnerships with Erwin Middle, FIRST at Blue Ridge, Goodwill Industries, Green Opportunities, and Big Ivy Community Center. The English Language Acquisition classes are offered off campus at Goodwill Industries and Episcopal Church of the Holy Spirit in Mars Hill. Partnering with Mission Health they have Project SEARCH, a yearlong on-the-job training and internship program for adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities. They also run a Hospitality Pipeline course in conjunction with Biltmore Farms, Biltmore Estate, and Goodwill creating job-training opportunities for adults with low levels of literacy.



Through the state's Customized Training Program, which provides

no-cost training and other resources to industry partners, the Advanced Manufacturing Center works with businesses of all sizes to improve our community's workforce. They have helped companies the size of GE-Aviation and Borg Turbo to New Belgium and Wicked Weed down to Hemp Magik and French Broad Chocolates train their employees to meet industry standards in continuous improvement, manufacturing quality, leadership, office support, and safety.

The **Workforce Programs Department** has numerous partnerships across A-B Tech's service area. Community Resource Centers such as the Edington Education and Career Center, NC Works Asheville Career Center, and Goodwill Industries are great partners to offer job and employment skills training courses at. Our Occupational and Skilled Trades department has started electrical apprenticeship programs with A-American Electric Inc. and IEW Local 238. Local high schools, Enka and Madison, have opened their doors to our classes. Our Business and Hospitality department runs a Whitewater Rafting Guide course in partnership with French Broad Adventures every spring.

For many getting there can be half the battle. The Workforce Programs Department works with Western Carolina Rescue Ministry and Veteran's Restoration Quarters to bring training to those most in need, many times at schedules as unique as the situations themselves. Workforce Programs is also able to partner with the Department of Public Safety to offer courses in the local prisons to prepare inmates to become contributing members of their communities and successful jobholders upon release.

A-B Tech's **Small Business Center** is currently partnering with the NC Cooperative Extension Office of Madison County to offer a seven-part seminar series on Agritourism.



What is your business?

Intertrigo is an infection that happens when moisture is trapped between layers of skin, in this case under pendulous stomachs. No Sweat is made of a high-end athletic fabric and has an under panel that absorbs and removes the sweat to insure a dry experience.

Why did you start a business?

I invented No Sweat because I suffered from reoccurring infections. There were very basic but unpleasant cures for this but nothing for prevention. I knew many, many people must have the same problem, and that no one was addressing this. After all, plus size people make up more than half of the population of the US.

How has the A-B Tech Small Business Center (SBC) assisted you?

A-B Tech Small Business Center has been essential in my success. From the beginning, I attended classes they offered. Whether it was from a SCORE mentor, the Western Women's Business Center, or any of their leaders in entrepreneurship, they always came through with classes, workshops and seminars that educated me to make good decisions. When there was help from another agency, they let me know and steered me to anyone who would further my business. The staff has answered all of my questions on strategy, sources, resources, procedures and helped me make contacts that I needed.

I have been lucky enough to be admitted to the SBC Incubator. This has opened even more doors for me.

What kind of progress have you made on a business and/or personal level since you started working with the Small Business Center?

Since I started working with the SBC, I have been able to get my business set up to take off. I arrived with a patented product, a stack of underwear and an eagerness to provide help to the community that needed them. I was a "babe in the woods." I had no idea what my journey would look like.

Is there anything that you want people to know about you or your business that they may not already know?

Waiting until you are perfect, things are perfect, and your bed is made isn't necessary. The world is moving, and you may have the idea that will help others move with it. I am a senior citizen with health problems. I grew up in a poor neighborhood in a blue-collar family. I have always had a job that I left after I put in my 8 hours. I was on disability for 15 years. I have controlled depression/anxiety. All these things make up who I am...as well as so much more. Everyone has something to give. And if your dream includes having your own business, go for it!
