Student Accident Insurance: A group policy, providing accident insurance protection, is maintained by the College and continuing education students are required to subscribe to such coverage. The only exception is for students taking only online courses. The cost of accident insurance to the student is a maximum of \$2.00.

Refund Policy: As established by the NC State Board of Community Colleges, a refund shall be made under the following circumstances: 1) If a student officially withdraws prior to the first class meeting, the student will receive a 100% refund (Motorcycle Safety is excluded); 2) If a class is canceled due to insufficient enrollment, a student will receive a 100% refund; 3) A 75% refund will be issued (Self-Supporting classes with prefixes CSP and SEF are excluded) if the student officially withdraws prior to or on the 10 percent point of the scheduled hours of class; 4) No refund will be made after the 10 percent point of the class; 5) The insurance, technology and supply/lab fees are refundable only if a class is canceled or the student drops before the class begins; 6) There will be a minimum of three to four weeks to process refunds.

Student Eligibility: Continuing education course offerings are designed for adult learners. In special cases, 16- and 17-year-olds will be considered when there is available space in the class.

Tobacco Free Campus

It is the policy of the Board of Trustees that Asheville-Buncombe Technical Community College provide students and employees with a safe and healthy environment. No form of tobacco, e-cigarette, or vaporizing device usage is permitted on A-B Tech's campuses, sites, or at College-affiliated activities and events.

Weapons On Campus Policy

The Board of Trustees prohibits the use or possession of any weapons on A-B Tech property or at any College sponsored activities or events except handguns as allowed by NC GS §14-269.4. Handguns are permitted under these circumstances:

- The person has a concealed handgun permit that is lawfully issued.
- The handgun is in a closed compartment or container within the person's locked vehicle.
- The handgun is in a locked container securely affixed to the person's vehicle.
- A person may unlock the vehicle to enter or exit the vehicle provided the handgun remains in the closed compartment at all times.
- The vehicle is locked immediately following the entrance or exit.

The above criteria do not apply to persons and/or situations outlined in GS §14-269, such as sworn law enforcement officers.

Any person found to be in violation of this policy shall be disciplined at the discretion of the A-B Tech administration. Additionally, any person found to be in possession of any weapon will be charged under State law with a misdemeanor or a felony, as stipulated by GS §14-269.2(b) and §14-269.2(c). Upon conviction, a person will be adjudicated at the discretion of the court.

Letter from the Vice President: Deborah Bailey

What a year it's been. Just after beginning fall classes last year, our region was hit by Hurricane Helene. Motorcycle Safety Education Program

If you experience significant difficulty or become a safety risk to yourself or others, you will not be permitted to continue to ride. To receive the NC Motorcycle Safety Education Program endorsement card you must attend one hundred percent of all scheduled course hours.

- The basics: what to wear, how to start and stop your motorcycle and motorcycle
- Street strategies to avoid trouble and stay

Community Partnerships: Per Scholas

Our partnership with Per Scholas, a national organization that is helping A-B Tech expand access to technology training across our region, continues to grow. We featured Per Scholas in the last issue to introduce the free IT Support course that prepares graduates for a number of high paying remote IT positions. Since then, two cohorts have begun and the next opportunity to register is in October.

A few years ago, during a routine program review, we recognized a gap in our ability to offer Information Technology (IT) classes through our Workforce Development programs. Despite our best efforts of tapping into local talent, connecting with digital nomads, and looking to collaborate elsewhere in the college, we simply didn't have the instructional capacity to meet the need.

Then we found Per Scholas. Or maybe they found us. Either way, the timing was just right. Per Scholas brings not only top-tier tech training but also the wraparound support services we know our students appreciate: coaching, career navigation, and connection to employers. Even better, the classes are free to students, thanks to grant funding that supports Per Scholas's expansion into Western North Carolina. This work has become even more critical in the aftermath of Hurricane Helene, as residents seek meaningful careers that allow them to stay in the region and rebuild.

Per Scholas North Carolina currently offers virtual tech training statewide and in-person training for residents in Northwest NC. They help connect graduates directly with employer partners, ensuring students don't just complete a class, they launch a career.







Classes are held Monday through Thursday, 8 a.m. – 3 p.m. The Barber Academy is a full-time program that will take 18-22 months to complete. Lectures, demonstrations, and hands-on practical work is designed to prepare students to apply for and pass the Apprentice licensing examination by the N.C. Board of Barber and Electrolysis Examiners (NCBBEE). The Apprentice licensing examination is a combination of shaving, tapered haircut, implements, anatomy, chemistry, chemical hair services, skin and hair histology, professionalism, and business practices.

The program is one of a few barber training programs in the state offered by community colleges and the only one offered west of Shelby. We hope that the information above was helpful and the Barbering Program looks forward to hearing from you!

Small Business Center Business Highlight: Darrell Thomas – Stencil Stylz

What is your business?

My business is a consumer product for children, an artistic reusable sidewalk chalk stencil I've designed called "Stencil Stylz".

Why did you start your business?

I started this business for several reasons: 1) to create a product for children that parents will understand and purchase, 2) to generate another stream of income, and 3) to create an affordable product that is easy to mass produce, with the hope of establishing a licensing deal with a company that might be interested in the product.

How has the A-B Tech SBC assisted you?

The A-B Tech Small Business Center has played a pivotal role in everything that I have been able to do thus far, such as counseling, workshops, collaborations, logistics and so much more. Duane, Jill, and Daphne always welcome me anytime I have business, or a meeting scheduled at Enka. Duane has done more than enough to help motivate, inspire, and give me the confidence needed to engage in the business world. Due to his impact and guidance, I have been given many opportunities to speak with large company representatives. I cannot begin to thank him enough for what he has taught me.

What is the most challenging aspect of owning a business?

Getting the orders shipped out with tracking, quality control, making sure everything with the customer's order is correct, and staying on top of inventory material and shipping cost, and protection of the product and the business itself.

What kind of progress have you made on a business and/or personal level since you started working with the SBC?

The progress I have made since coming to the SBC has been enormous. I have become a member of the Toy Association of America. I have been given the opportunity to attend The International Toy Show in New York for the past 6 years. I have been able to acquire a United States Patent on one of my inventions. I won a grant proposal contest. I also secured a \$250,000 investment for one of my ideas. Thanks to the SBC, I have been able to create a product, and have it sold online at Etsy, Walmart Marketplace, and Michaels. I'm currently having talks with Walmart personnel in hopes of having my Stencil Stylz product placed in their stores.

What advice would you give aspiring entrepreneurs?

My advice would be to do your homework. Learn your product, learn your customer base, learn your competition and learn about pricing. Understand the purpose of your product, understand how it solves a problem, and understand what makes your product different from others in the same category.

Is there anything that you want people to know about you or your business that they may not already know?

The one thing I would like to share about me and what I had to do to get opportunities is I've had to do a lot of sacrificing: fewer trips, less eating out, no frivolous spending, dedication of time, and determination. It's taken drive and a hunger to pursue something that could be life changing for my family and

It's also important to stay out of social media drama. You must keep in mind that when trying to conduct business with companies, or people in general, that these folks are going to be looking at any and everything on your social media platforms. My advice would be don't be the one who misses out on an opportunity or gets rejected by a business or person because of something on your social media. Being an entrepreneur can sometimes be hard, no sense in






