Course Sequencing

The sequence of courses in the catalog and on your education plan should be followed exactly. The Program Chair creates the education plans for each semester.

Program Chair certifies your “readiness” to take the National Certification Exam.

American Dental Association (ADA) requires expertise of the Program Administrators to determine who is qualified.

Dental Assisting National Board

- Criminal background questions on application and background checks may be performed by employer and may prevent employment if found to have a felony conviction on record.

Cardiovascular Sonography and Medical Sonography   Cardiovascular Sonography Medical Sonography	Sonographers use high frequency sound waves to produce dynamic visual images of organs, tissue, and blood flow. The program provides the individual with the knowledge and skills necessary to acquire, process and evaluate abdominal and pelvic organs, pregnancy, cardiac and vascular structures. Sonographers learn the normal appearance of organs and the different pathologies that can affect the structures that are examined. Sonography requires an in-depth understanding of clinical signs, symptoms and laboratory information associated with pathologies. The job outlook for 2021-2031 is 10% (faster than average) according to the US Bureau of Labor Statistics.
Dental Assisting 	One-year diploma program 100% employment rate Work alongside the dentist during fillings, extractions, crowns, root canals, etc., or can work in specialty offices
Dental Hygiene 	Employment of dental hygienists is projected to grow 9 percent from 2021 to 2031. Employment offers exciting and rewarding career opportunities. 100% employment rate 2-year program
Medical Laboratory Technology 	100% ASCP pass rate. 100% employment rate. Accredited by NAACLS, ensuring the highest standards of quality and excellence in education. Work in the laboratories of hospitals, doctor offices, research, and reference labs.
Occupational Therapy Assistant 	OTAs work with the entire population from newborns to hospice care with all different types of disabilities and challenges to participate in everyday life activities. Under the supervision of an Occupational Therapist, OTAs focus on providing treatments that help people with physical, psychological, and social needs to rebuild skills, health wellness, and functional independence in their homes and communities. Employment for OTAs is projected to grow 27% from 2018 to 2028.
